# Art Market 2023

Chairs included June Pederson, Sheila Green, Janet Phillips, Vicky Skuodas, Dean Settle / Tim Keelan, Lorna Parks, and the IQM Staff.

- NET ART MARKET REVENUE: \$15,235.49 7.6% higher than 2022. SALES were about 11.6% higher than 2022
- The Friends Booth had sales of \$8,049, significantly higher than the previous year.
- Credit card sales made up approximately 82% of the total with cash and check payments were 18%.
- There were 24 artists in 20 booths and total attendance was 599.
- The IQM Gift Shop reported sales of \$4,503 for the day.
- Dates for Next Years Art Market will be November 15/16, 2024. This is a week earlier than previous years.

# Mary Ghormley Final Lecture

The final Ghormley lecture was August 12 and featured afternoon tea. Tara Miller was the speaker. ## Give to Lincoln Day 2023

Give 2 Lincoln Day brought in \$8,700 in 2023. In 2020 and 2021 (the Covid years) we received a bit more than \$10,000 each year so we are working to reverse that trend this year with a goal of \$12,000.
